Why are there so many military coups in Africa? Why does the "rule by the people" not seem to work as we know it? Are the coups a destruction of democracy and/or are they forces to restore the rule of the people? Our guest, Professor Jeremias Zunguze, discusses the underlying historical and cultural factors that have combined to shape African democracy, where various forms of power and governance have continued to compete for sovereignty and monopoly, often resulting in seasonal-like military coups, civil wars, and proxy wars.

Born and raised in Mozambique, South-Eastern Africa, Dr. Zunguze is an Associate Professor of

Ethnic and Gender Studies, with a focus on Africana studies, at California State University


