The Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center (DLIFLC) is the largest foreign language school in the world. With 1,000 plus civilian faculty of which 95% are foreign born and educated in the countries of their birth. 84 % of

student body is multi service (Army, Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps) and must meet strict recruiting standards to include background investigations providing a Top Secret Security Clearance. Depending on the language they will study, they will undergo six to 15 months of daily intense language and cultural training and education. The student body includes officers and enlisted and is 26 % female. 66% of the student body is under the age of 25. Colonel Whitfield is the 32<sup>nd</sup> Commandant of the Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center. Prior to her appointment to DLI she served as the

senior intelligence officer in the Intelligence Directorate at the United States Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida. Her career has taken her to Korea and Italy and four year long combat deployments in




